

Coronavirus Update, Tuesday, June 16

We have received all test results back on the employees who had worked with the office employee who had tested positive for COVID-19. We are thankful to report that all results have been negative. The one employee who tested positive is at home, self-quarantined and will not be able to return to work until cleared by health officials. To our knowledge, there are no other positive cases among the membership or staff.

The State of Florida and Suwannee County continue to show significant increases in the number of new cases of the virus. Since our Friday report, Suwannee County has announced 23 new cases for a total of 208.

The increase in cases is a cause for concern and we are monitoring the situation closely. At the present time we do not have plans to scale back any of the limited areas we reopened, but we do strongly encourage everyone to remain vigilant and continue to follow the distancing and hygiene recommendations that remain in place. Everyone is also still required to wear a mask while participating in Village programs. Consult your Friendly Neighbor News for specific scheduling of programs and activities.

Likewise, the only way we can continue to ease restrictions for members is by limiting access to the campus. Screening procedures remain in place and you are asked to work with your Service Coordinator as you consider traveling outside the region or having family visit. We understand the needs of the community and will work with you as best we can.

Anyone who is uncomfortable getting out or is sick or exhibiting signs or symptoms of COVID-19 should remain in their home. If you are exhibiting signs, please consult your medical provider and Service Coordinator.
