If anything submitted to the FNN doesn't appear, please contact MS. We experienced some email issues this week, so we may not have received what you sent.

Due to an abundance of spills and messes, we have instituted a new bus policy effective immediately: No eating or drinking, and no open food or drink containers on either of ACV's buses effective immediately. The only exception is plain water. Thank you for your cooperation.

On the topic of eating and drinking, while there is no set policy (yet), we would ask you to refrain from eating and drinking in interior locations other than those designated for such activities. While we know it is never your intent to make a mess, accidents happen, and while the furnishings in the Lopin' Gopher, RDR, SMR, DR, and OPR are designed to handle food, the other locations in Phillips are not. I speak particularly about the chairs by the IC, the ACV library, and the hallways surrounding SMR and DR. Please refrain from eating and drinking in those locations to avoid accidentally making a mess that is difficult to clean.

Member Services Tip of the Week

If you have outdated or unwanted medications in your home, they can be deposited into the MedSafe collection kiosk located at the Village Pharmacy. MedSafe is an unused and expired medication disposal system. This easy-to-operate system accepts controlled (Schedules II-V), non-controlled, and over-the-counter medicines.

Scam Tip of the Week: Tolls Scam

A popular scam right now is a text that reads something similar to "Florida Toll Services, our records show that your vehicle has an outstanding toll charge. To prevent further fees totaling \$75.59, please settle the due amount of \$7.59 at mysunpastollsinvoices.com." If you receive a text similar to this, delete it. If your phone allows you to report the text as well, go ahead and do that. Whatever you do, don't click on the link. SunPass posted a warning on its website, warning customers the messages were not sent by SunPass and are a phishing scam targeting the public. "SunPass does not ask customers via text to make a payment or to take immediate action on their account."

RW HOA had a very informative meeting on Monday. Tom Rowand and Jennilyn Bruce were introduced from Total Professional Association Management. The meeting was well attended. Their website is TPAM.com. Submit your e-mail address to portal.goenumerate.com/login if you want to be contacted by e-mail. The automation process for HOA payments was discontinued in January while in the transition to the management

company. The transition should be completed by the end of March 2025. As of January 2025, the monthly HOA assessment is \$127.00. NOTE: The autopay for the \$190 ACV membership fee is still in effect. You will get a newsletter from the HOA with a full explanation of changes.

When we moved into our house, we replaced the roof and the appliances. If you have purchased an LG Slide-In and Freestanding Electric Range, there is a recall of more than 500,000 ranges, which were sold at multiple retailers. They have been recalled because they pose a fire hazard. The LG ovens have front-mounted knobs that can be accidentally activated by contact with humans and animals, which poses a severe fire concern. The recall was announced by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) on Feb. 6 after the organization received at least 86 reports of unintentional activation of the range's knobs. You'll know if you have the recalled stoves by checking the model number and serial number located inside the oven door or storage door on the bottom of the oven. (I have a list of at least 20 model numbers and serial numbers.)

NO-CHURN ICE CREAM (Homestead Recipe)

2 cups "fresh" strawberries, black cherries, blueberries, or red raspberries
28 oz. (2 cans) sweetened condensed milk
1/2 cup lemon juice (strain if you squeeze it fresh)

1. Combine ingredients in a blender. Purée until smooth.
2. Pour mixture in storage container with tight-fitting lid, and freeze 6-8 hours.
