Do you walk around Lake Aquilla? Have you noticed how the sidewalks are slowly being covered up by duck poop, and it's becoming more and more difficult to avoid stepping in/rolling through the piles? This is why ACV discourages feeding the ducks. It makes the wildlife comfortable around humans and encourages them to leave the safety of the lake and hang around areas visited by us. We do not have a policy against feeding the ducks, but we do want to make you aware of the complications that are created when you do.

Scam Tip of the Week: Amazon Scam

A top scam this year is the "Suspicious Activity Scam". The scammer sends you an email or text saying they have suspended or deleted your account due to suspicious activity. They'll want you to verify your account by giving away your login and password or your payment information.

Another scam is the "Fake Order Confirmation" message. It refers to a purchase that you actually didn't make. The scam message says you need to click a malicious link to confirm or cancel the order.

How can you protect yourself against these kinds of impersonation scams? Here are a few tips from Amazon:

Verify your purchases on Amazon: If you receive a message about a purchase, don't respond to the message or click any link. Instead, log into your Amazon account or go on your Amazon app to confirm the purchases you've made or not made.

Use Amazon first: No matter what the message or call says, use Amazon's website or app to verify what's going on.

Don't give away your information: Amazon doesn't ask for payment over a phone call, text or email. It will only ask for payment through the app or on the website.

Be wary of urgency: Scammers will try to create a sense of urgency to persuade you to do what they're asking without you thinking twice about it.

Don't be pressured to buy a gift card: Amazon will never ask you to purchase a gift card to make a sale or a transaction.

Research it: If you get a message or call that strikes you as out of the ordinary, type it into Google or your preferred search engine. See if anyone else has reported a similar situation. You can also look it up on Amazon's website or the Better Business Bureau. There is a scam tracker on the website.

Contact Amazon: If you're unsure of what's being sent to you, stop engaging completely. Contact Amazon directly through the website or app. Do not use an email or phone number that's in the suspicious message.

Even if you do not have an Amazon account, these same steps work for any online retail store.

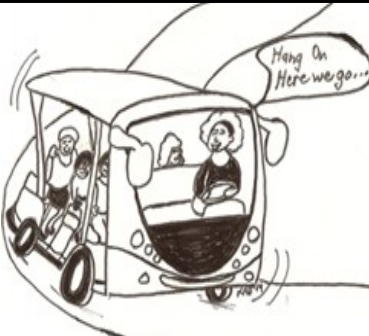

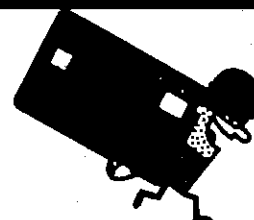
